U.S. World and News Report *Reprint: Deadly Virus Outbreak!* Joseph David Reporting *World-wide Crisis!* Sunday, April 2021 *A PARABLE WITH A HIDDEN MESSAGE*

It is difficult to understand how we came to this point. Today is a rather typical Sunday. Families are enjoying a beautiful morning. There are picnickers, bikers, and joggers. The southern beaches and pools are crowded and thousands have escaped to the mountains. They all seem to *forget* and it is hard to imagine how.

It started just a few months ago with the announcement over CNN of the virus outbreak in China. An extremely **lethal strain of the virus** infected thousands of people. The hospitals were swamped and no one was prepared with the proper medicine to bring healing to the sick.

The seriousness of the situation did not become apparent until 4 cases of virus cropped up in India and 2 in Australia. Each of the persons involved had recently traveled from China.

Authorities in the Far East immediately mobilized their medical resources. It seemed that the virus was highly contagious and always fatal. No one was aware of a cure or any effective way to treat it. Within days, tens of thousand were ill in India alone. The virus had spread to all parts of the Far East, Philippines, and Australia, Twenty seven cases were identified in various parts of Africa, and Europe grounded all flights from the infected regions.

Doctors around the world were looking furiously for anything that could stop the deadly virus. Within weeks, nearly a half million had died and it appeared millions more would soon die.

At first the European quarantine appeared to work. But without explanation, two people in Belgium and 4 in Switzerland came down with the virus and it began to spread like wildfire throughout Europe and all of Asia.

Authorities in the United States and other western hemisphere nations closed their borders. Schools were closed. University labs, drug companies, and research centers focused all of their efforts on finding a cure for this deadly sickness.

It was clear that once a person was exposed to the virus that it would overwhelm their immune defenses within weeks if you were healthy. The very old, could only hold out for days.

....all of mankind would succumb.

The outbreak in the United States began in California. Within weeks, the virus was reported in every state, in every city of the country. It was clear everyone was exposed to this fatal virus and it would only be a matter of time before all of mankind would succumb.

The announcement of a **potential vaccine** by Doctor Andrew White of Johns- Hopkins Medical Center fanned a wave of encouragement. The doctor discovered a vaccine could be created from the blood of an uninfected person. The process could be done quickly and millions and millions of lives could be saved once the vaccine was ready and distributed.

The problem was, essentially every living person seemed to have already been exposed to this virus. None-the-less, the **White House ordered** the testing of every citizen in hopes of finding one who's blood remained pure.

Mountain Valley provides emergency relief through Health & Welfare, and various missions by the men's & women's groups.

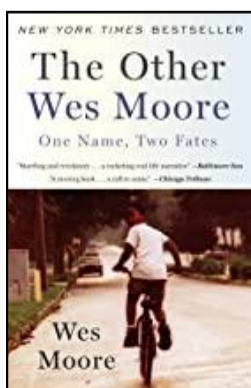
There is an emergency prayer chain, prayer shawl group, book club, and Bible studies which help one to grow in fellowship, mind and spirit.

From our Parish Nurse.....

Greetings to you and those you love. As we begin to come out of the isolation of COVID we look at activities we can again do safely as a community and church and hope you can join us. I'm sure this past year has brought changes and losses including income, and for some even the loss of family and/or friends. We mourn those losses as we attempt to pick up the pieces of our lives. Over 600,000 persons have died related to COVID in the United States this past year. This is comparable to the yearly deaths due to cancer. We now have a vaccine that helps to protect us as individuals and over 2 billion have been administered worldwide. There are still many here in the US who have chosen not to get it although it is now available at no charge and there are many more throughout the world who still do not have it available for them. We hear now of variant strands developing which may develop into an epidemic and those not vaccinated are vulnerable. The Center for Disease Control advises that those who have been fully vaccinated can resume activities without wearing a mask or physical distancing, except where required by federal, state, or local laws and regulations. The Center for Disease Control is encouraging everyone to be vaccinated age 12 and above. You can register with our local Central Shenandoah Health District at vaccineappointments.virginia.gov or call your local health department (Rockingham county Social Services at 540-574-5100) to schedule and find sites COVID vaccines are being offered. As we look to the future, we at Mountain Valley UMC plan to have a health fair with our upcoming Old Fashioned Days, October 16. At that time we will have regular flu vaccines and possibly COVID vaccines available. We will be letting you know more about this. I hope you stay well and stay safe.

Which brings us to the day that this reporter first became deeply involved and seriously concerned. Like every other citizen, I was tested and so was every member of my family. It was a beautiful Sunday. We were gathered in the parking lot outside the testing center, waiting to hear the results of our testing. There were thousands of others all around us doing the same. That is when I heard the announcement that started the **change of my outlook on all of humanity**. The speakers blared, "Joseph David, please bring your family to the emergency room immediately. I grabbed the hands of my wife, Mary, and son Josh, and worked my way through the crowd.

Several of the doctors greeted us with big smiles and tremendous excitement. "Mr. David, your son Joshua is the first and only person we or anyone else has tested that shows no signs of infection. His blood is *perfectly pure* and just what we need to make the vaccine that can save the world. I began to be caught up in the joy of realizing there was hope after all. I was proud that my son would be the one that would save humankind.

The doctors thrust a number of medical papers in front of me for signatures. Only a lawyer could sort out all of the fine print and technical jargon. But I began to realize this wasn't as simple as it first appeared.
