## What's so Good About Good Friday?

1. In the post midnight hours of early morning, Jesus was arrested by Temple Guards. The Disciples, his best friends, deserted him in fear.
2. Still in the dark of the very early morning, he was brought before the Jewish authorities who wanted him silenced. In a rigged trial, they convicted him of blasphemy – an offense to God. Ironic, because he spent his life drawing others to faith in God.
3. Those who condemned him, then blindfolded, spat on and beat him, and threw him in a pit until daybreak.
4. As morning breaks he is dragged before the Roman Governor with a request to have him executed. Pontius Pilate did not find him guilty of wrongdoing. He offered to release him.
5. The Gathered crowd chanted for the release of another and for Jesus to be crucified. This was the Roman's most horrible, painful, drawn-out method for death.
6. He was flogged, nailed to a cross, ridiculed, taunted and died.

1. The Big Bang Theory- accepted by most scientists around the world. The Universe began in a single instant and has been expanding every since. 2. The disciples tell the story best. They went from cowards at the arrest to far ranging apostles, telling of Jesus resurrection from death and the love and forgiveness he offers all. Most all of them died for taking that stance.

Would you be willing to die for what you knew was a lie?



## Police Report



When there is an accident or a crime, investigators question all the witnesses to reconstruct the facts of the matter. Different witnesses see things from different angles, some missing what others pickup, and vice versa.

Following is a combined summary account from 4 testimonies of the resurrection event. You can read them in detail in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

1. Sunday, Dawn, 3 women arrive at tomb to anoint the body. Massive stone sealing tomb is already rolled away. Roman guards had fled their posts.
2. An angel present at the scene declares, "He is not here. He is risen!"
3. Women reported all to Disciples. Disciples skeptical- John and Peter went to tomb to investigate.
4. Corroborating stories- John and Peter saw grave clothes lying in place, but no body. Had the body been stolen the wrappings would have gone with it rather than laying in place undisturbed.
5. Disciples still not fully sure of what is going on and return to quarters.
6. First sighting: Mary Magdalene, one of the women still on scene was approached by who she thinks may be the gardener. When he calls her name she recognizes it is Jesus, himself, risen from the grave.
7. Second sighting: Two disciples walking home to nearby village of Emmaus, distressed, perplexed and mourning the day's events. Joined by a stranger who listened to their grief and then began to explain how these events had been foretold for years through the scriptures. The two reported inviting the stranger to eat with them in Emmaus and through his blessing and breaking of the bread for the meal, they realized they were and had been all along in the presence of Jesus. They can't explain why but they knew with all their heart that it was so.
8. The Emmaus twosome hurried back to Jerusalem to report all to the other gathered disciples.
9. At first there was skepticism of their report, but then Jesus suddenly appeared in the room so all could see and know. It became clear to those present he was real, not a spirit. He ate with them and blessed them all before vanishing again.
10. There have been additional reports of these resurrection appearances in Galilee, outside of Jerusalem and other places as well.

For more precise detail and expanded information refer to the Bible records of the four writers mentioned above. They consider it to be very good news as do most people who have become familiar with this incredible event.


